FINDING HOPE IN NUMBERS

As a result of the pandemic, cancer care providers have found little solace in numbers regarding screenings.

A May 2022 story from the National Cancer Institute said, "An estimated 9.4 million screening tests that normally would have taken place in the United States in 2020 didn't happen," as a result of a number of factors related to the COVID pandemic.

In the pages of this 2021 annual report, you'll find reason to be hopeful. Look at our lung cancer screenings, for example. True, the number of new patients took a small hit in 2020, but bounced back well in 2021 and finished the year more than 400% higher than in 2016.

Responses to other Cancer Center screenings are equally as encouraging, including the "Kit Return Rate" for the free colorectal cancer screening test. It exceeded 60 percent in 2020 after results in the low 50 percent range during the three preceding years.

Other exciting news in this report includes renewed accreditation, continuing national recognition for high performance and the first success for clinical research at the Center.

The work we do is a team effort. Please take pride of the accomplishments listed in this report as you play a key role in bringing high quality cancer services to the communities we serve.





2021 TOTAL PATIENTS INITIALLY DIAGNOSED AND/OR TREATED




Patient Data: Cancers Treated, Quincy

Every year, the Blessing Cancer Center hosts multiple free screenings for different types of cancer - especially prostate and skin - in addition to the free colorectal cancer screening kits given out each March and our low dose CT screening program for lung cancer.

Early intervention and education is also a focus of the Blessing Cancer Center, with over 400 4th grade students in Adams County attending a presentation by the Community Outreach Educator on the many dangers and health risks of tobacco and vaping.


